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MEI Dialysis Decision Aid Receives 2014 GOLD Web Health Award

Madison, WI – *My Life, My Dialysis Choice* (MyDialysisChoice.org), a free, online decision aid, has received a 2014 **GOLD Web Health Award** in the Web-based Resource/Tool category. Developed by the non-profit **Medical Education Institute (MEI)**, the tool helps people with chronic kidney disease (CKD) see how various types of dialysis would fit their lifestyle and health values.

Patients with late-stage CKD are faced with choices that will affect their lifestyles and longevity. “*My Life, My Dialysis Choice* helps CKD patients understand all of the dialysis options,” said MEI Executive Director, Dori Schatell, MS. “The method of dialysis has a huge effect on quality of life, and can influence a patient’s ability to keep a job, maintain a normal family life, and continue to enjoy the things that make life worth living.”
